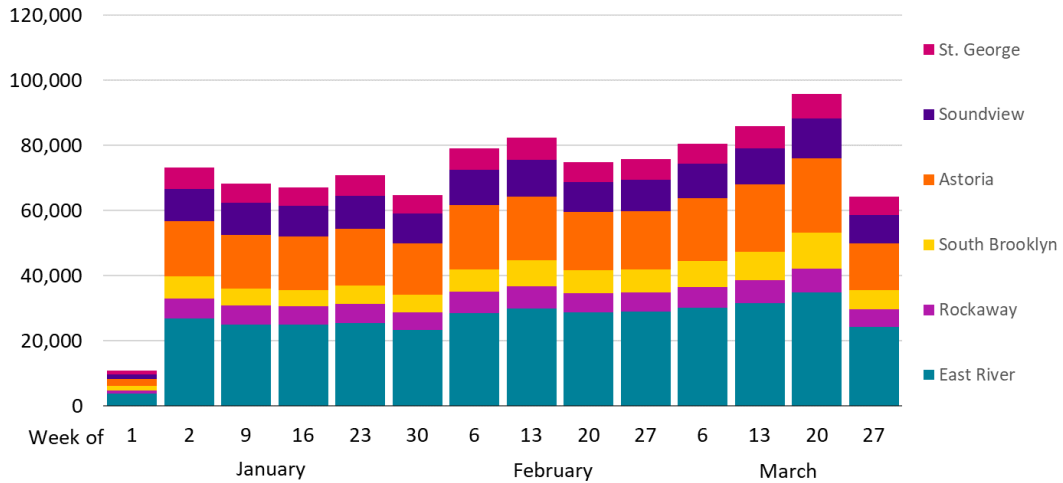

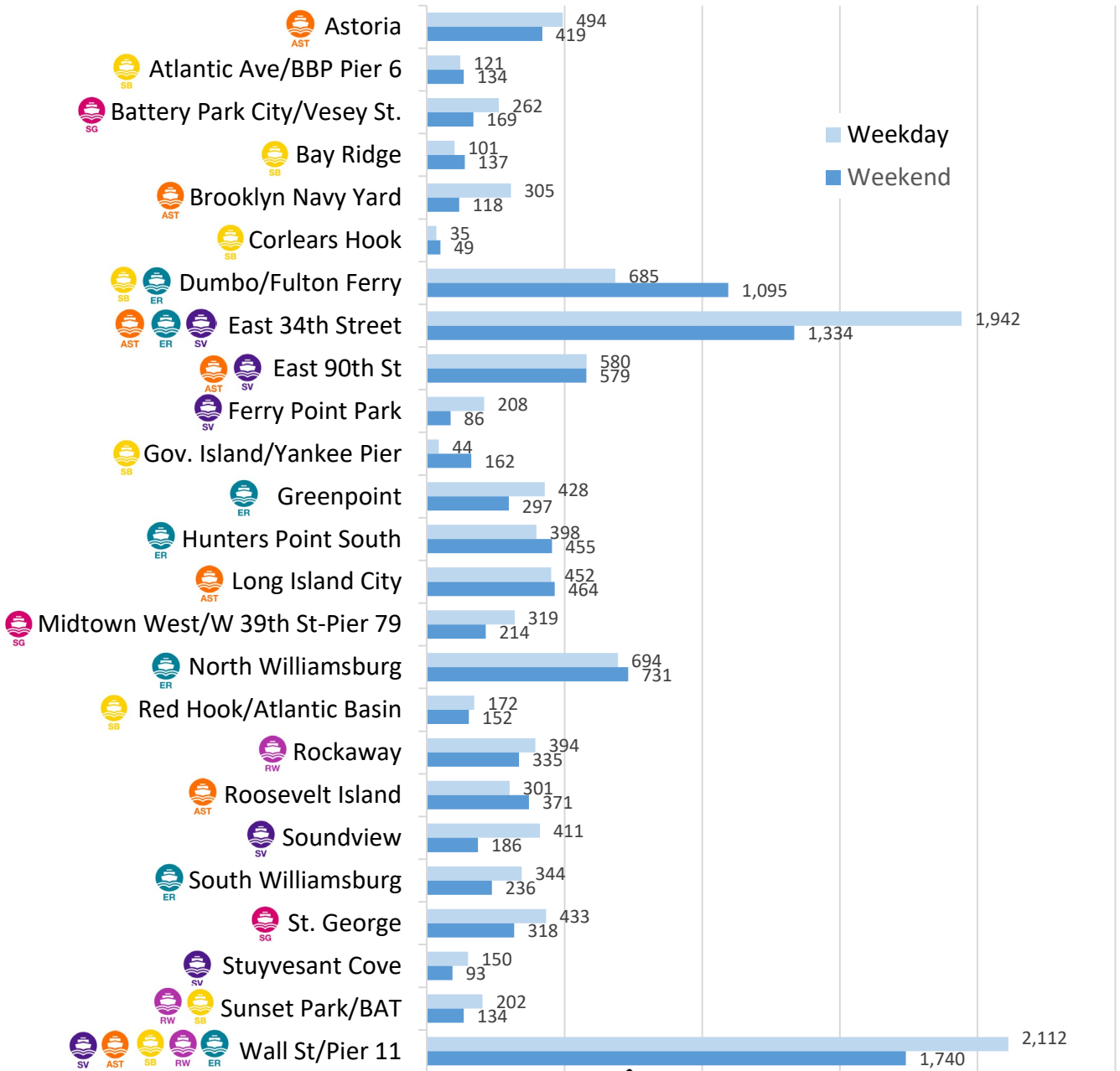

Highlights



Service Notes

There were over 1M riders in Q1 2023, NYCF's highest ridership in the first quarter ever since launch. On 3/8, the South Brooklyn Faster Connections Pilot launched, providing riders along the South Brooklyn route a faster travel time to Pier 11 on weekday mornings, with no additional cost to the system.

NYC Ferry operated a weekend schedule on 1/2, 1/16, and 2/20. A modified Holiday schedule was operated on New Years Day. The Governors Island landing was out of service for planned maintenance from 12/19/22 and reopened on 3/8/23.

¹On Time Performance is calculated as the percentage of trips that departed no more than 1 minute before and arrive no more than 5 minutes past their scheduled times at each landing. This report does not include delays due to events outside of the control of NYC Ferry, such as vessel traffic, river closures/obstructions, extreme weather conditions, and other U.S. Coast Guard restrictions. When tracking devices are offline, the stops are excluded from the calculation. ²Number of NYCF-branded vessels available for use.
