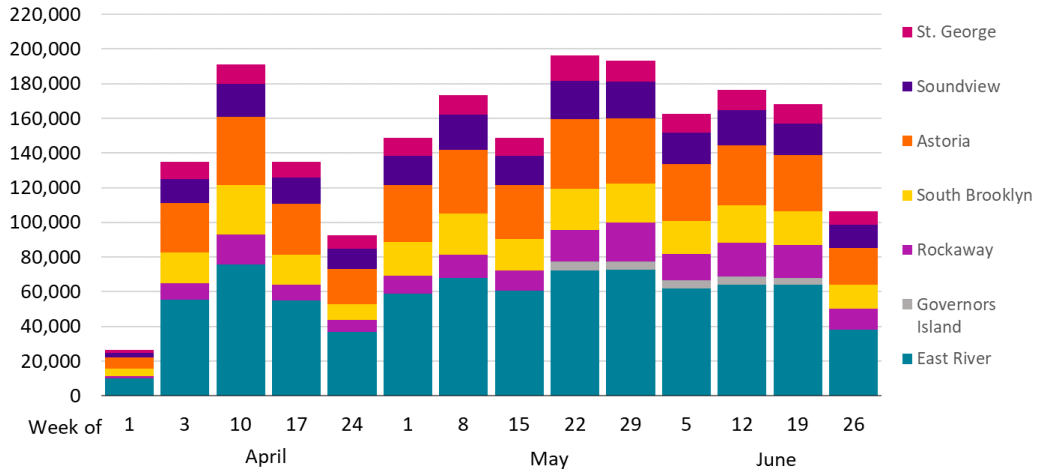

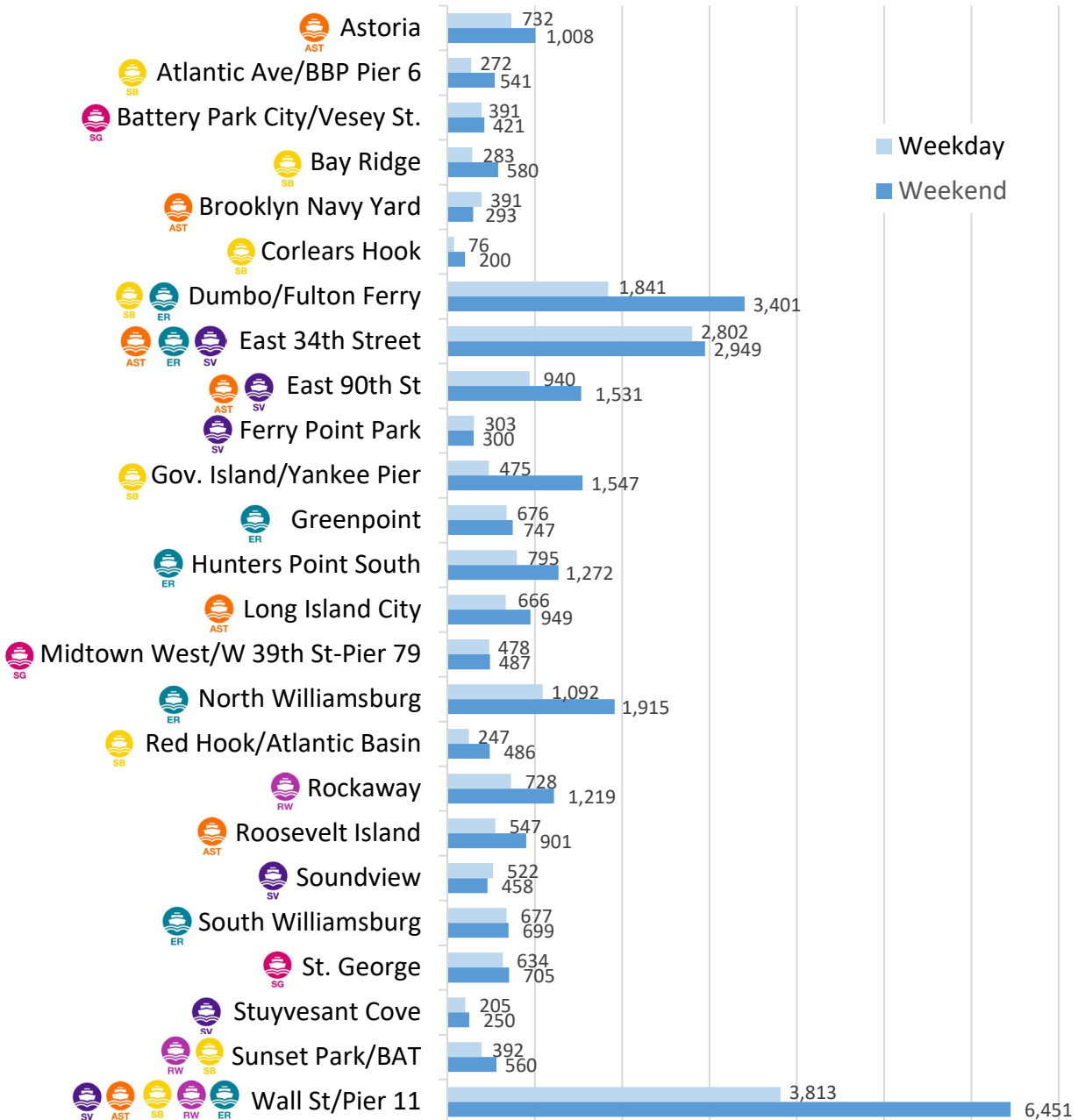

Highlights



Service Notes

During Passover and Spring Break, NYC Ferry had its most productive weekday ever with over 32,000 riders on 4/10. Over 2M riders boarded NYCF in Q2 2023, the system's highest Q2 ridership since launch. AS, SV, SB, and SG had their highest Q2 ridership ever.

A special Passover schedule operated from 4/10-4/12 and a weekend schedule operated on 5/29 and 6/19. On 5/26, NYC Ferry assisted Staten Island Ferry during a labor shortage with free point-to-point service from Pier 11 to St. George that carried 1,565 passengers.

¹On Time Performance is calculated as the percentage of trips that departed no more than 1 minute before and arrive no more than 5 minutes past their scheduled times at each landing. This report does not include delays due to events outside of the control of NYC Ferry, such as vessel traffic, river closures/obstructions, extreme weather conditions, and other U.S. Coast Guard restrictions. When tracking devices are offline, the stops are excluded from the calculation. ²Number of NYCF-branded vessels available for use.
